Dear Fellow Parishioners,

This is an exciting time at St. James -- time to fulfill our dream and vision of a new church!

Frequently Asked Questions

As we begin our "*Grounded* in Faith ~ *Growing* to Serve ~ *Embracing* Our Future" Capital Campaign to build a beautiful new church and develop an even stronger Catholic presence in Liberty, we have been asked many good questions. This FAQ answers your most commonly asked questions.

What are the results so far of the 2013-2015 capital campaign?

We are very happy to report that \$3.1M was pledged and over \$2.4M to date has been collected.

\$1.1M was spent on the parking lot and landscaping, and there is over \$585K in the bank. We have three more months of pledges to collect in 2015, and we will be working for a strong campaign finish.

How many households pledged?

700 of our 1,975 households made one-time gifts or three-year pledges. We had a 35 percent participation rate. Our consultant tells us that 25-35 percent participation is good for larger parishes.

I was under the impression that we would run the 2013-2015 campaign, take out a loan, and then start building. What happened?

We had hoped that would be the case, but our goal was too much for one campaign. We see this more clearly now.

The church building phase of our plan is forecast to cost \$8,185,211. The Diocesan Bank requires us to have \$6,138,908 (75%) in pledges and \$4,092,606 (50%) in cash for a loan. As we begin the church phase, we want to stay on plan and reach those thresholds.

Would you say our 2013-2015 campaign was successful?

Yes, for the way that we ran this campaign we were very successful! We had a great Steering Committee and group of volunteers. We are in this for the long-term. We know our current church cannot sustain us and that the city and county will be growing for the next 15 years.

Is the building of a new church a shortterm or a long-term project?

The building and paying for a new church will be a long-term project. As we continue to be a growing area and a growing church and school, we will be in growth mode for some time.

Taking two or three campaigns to build and pay for a church is not unusual.

Do you believe we can do this?

Yes, we do. And more importantly, God knows we can. God has put us in a growing area. The needs are going to increase. The opportunity to touch hearts and lives with the Gospel are amazing. It was the young, Irish laundry girls who built St. Patrick's Cathedral with their pennies. It was our grandparents who built beautiful churches throughout our Diocese and country. As God helped them, He will help and amaze us! From now on it's "all hands on deck!"

Financial Plan For Building A New Church

Moving forward with our Design Build Master Plan, we performed a feasibility study to make sure we were advancing in the right direction. The result was a strong affirmation of: Build a NEW CHURCH. The figures on this page represent what we have accomplished, where we need to go and the strategy to raise the funds to finance the project.

Our Design Build Master Plan was developed in 2012. It is a long-range plan and like all plans is subject to adjustment as the actual development and construction costs become apparent. The below figures are as close an estimate as we can make at this time.

Mission Statement

We, the community of St. James, are a prayerful and Eucharistic people who treasure our Catholic traditions.

We strive to grow in our faith by being good stewards of the gifts God has given us: sharing God's truth with all.

As the Body of Christ, we are called to love and serve everyone, especially the marginalized, with joy and hospitality.

For over 175 years, St. James has been the pillar of the Catholic community in Liberty. We have a proud tradition and history that we hope to keep alive for generations to come. The presence of God is experienced daily by all who enter through the doors of our church.

Our present church was built in 1981. At that time it was believed that it would meet the needs of Catholic residents in Liberty and the surrounding areas for many years into the future. No one imagined the exponential growth that would take place over the next 35 years and beyond.

- In 1988, St. James consisted of 665 households; by 1997 that number had grown to 1,000. Today we have 2,000+ households a 100 percent increase in 18 years and St. James, Liberty, and Clay County are continuing to grow!
- Liberty's population grew from 26,352 residents in 2000 to 30,096 residents in 2014. A 14 percent increase.
- Clay County's population has grown from 184,820 residents in 2000 to 230,473 residents today. A 25 percent increase!
- Over the next 15 years, Cass, Clay, and Platte Counties are projected to grow 62 percent.

Clearly the dynamics of Liberty and the Northland is changing!

We have outgrown the capacity of our current church for the 2,000 families registered at St. James. Our church is limited to seating approximately 500 people while another 50 can attend Mass from the Narthex. At times people, seeing the crowded situation, have left to attend Mass at another church.

Building a new church is critical in order for us to continue to grow and provide numerous opportunities for our parish community. As a Christ-centered parish it is our obligation to prepare for the future and embrace our responsibility. How else will we serve in ministries, services, evange-lization, and educating the community about our Catholic faith? We must have vision, willingness to become involved, and daily prayer for our continued success.

The "*Grounded* in Faith ~ *Growing* to Serve ~ *Embracing* Our Future" Campaign is not just a building campaign – it creates a legacy for our Catholic faith and our willingness to serve the Lord.

Going Higher - Go Farther!

Our *Grounded* in Faith - *Growing* to Serve - *Embracing* Our Future Capital Campaign to build our new church is the biggest effort God has ever called us to. We can only do this together, and we can only do this if each of us makes our own kind of gift and sacrifice.

To start thinking about your gift, seek to do the following:

- Look over the gift chart.
- Let your eyes rest on the largest threeyear gift you think you can make.
- Now, consider a sacrificial gift. Consider going one level higher: from the more comfortable level to the more sacrificial level
- Think of the generous example of your grandparents and pray, "Lord, what do you want to do – through me – for my parish?"
- Let the Spirit lead you to a place that is satisfying and sacrificial!
- The only way most of us can go one level higher is by A) giving something up for awhile or B) putting off purchasing something for awhile.

Ways We Can Give More

Which of the following could you or your family use to increase your giving?

TAX SAVINGS. Additional giving can create additional tax savings. One person whose \$6,910 contribution resulted in a tax savings of \$1,800. This enabled the person to give \$8,710.

DIVERTED FUNDS GIFTS. Freeing up funds from one area allows a person to give to other areas. Diverting funds from entertainment, dining out, dues, subscriptions, gifts, allowances, utilities, transportation, etc., and other lifestyle adjustments can impact one's giving.

DELAYED EXPENDITURES. Delaying purchases allows a person to significantly increase giving. The acquisition of major items such as automobiles, clothing, trips, houses, etc., when postponed, allows substantial giving opportunities.

SAVINGS AND ANNUITIES. Savings for special projects, retirement, or that "rainy day" offer a resource for increased giving. Often, we realize that our savings may not be needed for our original purpose and are available to God's work.

CORPORATE GIFTS. Those who have used their business as a resource for giving have made significant donations. Two brothers donated all the HVAC for their church's project.

SALES OF ASSETS. Sales of major assets, such as a house, car, land, business, etc., provide available income for giving. One person made a substantial commitment from his house sale.

GIFTS IN KIND/APPRECIABLE ASSETS. Gifts like stocks, bonds, real estate, automobiles, collections, jewelry, yachts, etc., provide ample giving opportunities, coupled with significant tax savings as well.

INCOME RAISES/BONUSES. Dedicating one's forthcoming raises and bonuses are creative methods people have used to increase giving.

INCOME PRODUCING ASSETS. Interest income, payments from rental properties and monies from other income-producing assets provide a source for increased giving.

FREEDOM FROM DEBT. Reduced debt obligations can help increase a pledge. One family completed a \$300 a month automobile payment and increased their pledge.

CHARITABLE GIVING RESOURCES. One man, who gave \$25,000 a year to his university, diverted those gifts to his church for three years, and then resumed his school giving.

ADDITIONAL WORK INCOME. Taking a second job or part time job, coming out of retirement, or working overtime, are strategies people have used.

Campaign Prayer


Gracious and loving God, we thank you for your many blessings, and turn to you with grateful hearts in anticipation for what is yet to be.
